REGATTA ROOM INFO

After our post-Regatta meeting with the Nautical management last year, this is the deal with Regatta rooms. The rates are as follows for Sept. 7-9, 2001:

Beach Room	\$ 99.00
Bay	\$139.00
Parlor Suites	\$149.00
Jr. & Deluxe Suites	\$325.00

The rest of the contract with the Nautical reads as follows:

"These rates are net, non-commissionable and do not reflect sales tax or the city occupancy tax, currently totalling 10.78%. Above rates apply to 10 or more rooms per night. If less than 10 are reserved, published rates will apply.

It is our understanding that individuals participating in this event will make their own guest room reservations prior to the cut-off date, August 6, 2001. All reservation requests received after this date will be subject to space availability, and be at published rates. Once an individual reservation has been made, all changes should be made directly through our reservations department at (520) 855-7141

Reservations being made by individuals that are part of a group block are subject to a 72 hour advance cancellation if on weekends from March 15-November 1. The cancellation is subject to both nights if within 72 hours."

In other words, if you do not reserve by August 6, your room will be subject to availability and at the regular rate. Plan to join us at the Regatta and reserve early!

A NICE STORY

When Fritz and Mary Lee Duda decided to sell their 21' Superwailer ZIPPTY DUDA II, they offered to donate the proceeds to "deserving institutions in Lake Havasu City who need the money." Presented with various choices, they decided to split the proceeds between Our Lady of the Lake Catholic Church, which is in the middle of a building expansion campaign, and the new Lake Havasu Museum of History, which is currently building its exhibits. This museum has been a long term project of the Historical Society, of which I am currently vice-president. The boat sold and both the Museum and the Church received a donation of over \$4000 as a gift to Lake Havasu from a family who has always enjoyed their time here.

On a personal note, I thought it was very fitting that the museum, which is located in the London Bridge Shopping Center between the Dairy Queen and the office of the Chamber of Commerce and Visitors and Convention Bureau, is located just across the street from the old Rodeway Inn (now the Holiday). 

LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT


It's already 90 degrees here in late March, so we're anticipating a great (and early) boating season.

Judy and I have completed the restoration of our 1977 Campbell 28 "Snoopy," and are giving it sea trials in preparation for use on Lake Powell this summer. We will be roughing it with the generator, air conditioning and heating, microwave, ceramic cook top, hot and cold water, etc. We even have four crystal decanters for a classy selection of drinks. Snoopy will be available for viewing at the Spring Roundup.

The Lake Havasu City Council's Shoreline Acquisition and Preservation Commission, of which I am co-chairman, has completed its first report, which included an inventory of all ownership parcels on the island and on the mainland from the wildlife refuge on the north to the mainland marina site south of Contact Point on the south. Our goal is to protect public access to all the shoreline by protecting that which is now undeveloped, and by securing access on parcels that have been developed. I believe that we have a very good chance of being successful in the five year target time frame. As you know, Havasu is growing and the city realized the need to plan ahead.
