Winding up everything on the beach around 4, the action turns to Bridgewater Channel for the Campbell Boat Parade beginning at 6 P.M.





If you meet these two on Havasu in their Campbell 24's, do not be tempted to race for pink slips ...




Bob welcomes Governor Fife Symington and Mayor Dick Hileman to the GREEN LIMOUSINE for a boat tour of Lake Havasu.
