SPRING ROUNDUP — SAT., APRIL 30



<u>\$UM FUN</u> – 17 YEARS OF CAMPBELL BOATING

One of the benefits of going to the L.A. Boat Show is having a chance to talk with different Campbell owners, many of whom we have known since we bought the company in 1973.

So when Ida and Norm Wenzel stopped by, we asked for a history of <u>\$UM FUN</u>. No two owners have the same story of how or why they came to buy their Campbells and for sure no other owner bought a boat because Bob sold their house!

As Ida tells it...she and Norm had been admiring Campbells while boating on Havasu and got more interested after being invited aboard GOOD TIME CHARLIE. They found out that the factory was near their Havasu house and one afternoon, after watching young Lynn launch his rockets just north of the factory, they stopped by for Bob's tour. This led to a demo next day on the 24'. Norm was impressed by the boat's responsiveness and Ida, with two young children, liked its

stability. Ida remembers telling Bob, "We'll trade you our Havasu house for a Campbell!"

Three weeks later they got a call from Bob at their home in Redlands – "I have a buyer for your house!" So when they came out to sign escrow papers they picked out the boat's colors (they already had the name), and \$UM FUN was delivered Thanksgiving weekend of 1976.

For the past 17 years the boat has been a member of the Wenzel family. La Dana remembers that as she grew up, the wake "kept getting smaller." And Lynn, who first found that wake so challenging, now glides over it barefoot. Ida considers the Campbell "the best family investment we ever made," a sentiment shared by the many friends who learned to ski behind the boat and also caught a case of "\$UM FUN fever." The boat has been used everywhere from Colorado to Newport Harbor and has outlived two tow vehicles. As her reward, she is now back at the factory, being completely refurbished. The Wenzels are changing her a bit to reflect their changed boating style — adding a marine radio, Porta-Potti, etc. as they still camp on her every summer. Sometime around SPRING ROUNDUP the kids will come in from Colorado and the "new" \$UM FUN will be rechristened. "After all," says Ida, "Not only has she given our family and friends hundreds of hours of great boating, but she has also been our marriage insurance. Whenever things got tense, we had to stop and say, 'But if we divorce, who would get the Campbell??""


