

### LETTER from the PRESIDENT



## I have some good news and some interesting news...

The good news is that Lake Havasu City's carbon monoxide monitoring and control

system just completed its first year successfully. CO was carefully monitored in the channel each weekend and the results were displayed on large signs in the channel. On the 5 or 6 occasions when the air quality was unsafe, our officers closed the entrance to the channel. On all occasions the air returned to safe quality in about 1 1/2 hours. We also measured the blood absorption level of our employees working in the channel, as a backup. There were no reported health instances this season.

The interesting news is that the Lake Havasu Marina has started measuring boat noise levels and several other law enforcement agencies are planning to follow suit. A stock Campbell 454 vee drive with under-water through hull wet exhausts will pass the test, as well all I/Os with through hub exhausts. Boats which don't pass will have to launch elsewhere and will not be allowed to rent a slip in the Marina.

The high performance people have brought this on themselves. As you know, some of the boats are really painfully loud. If you have loud exhausts, you will be turned away from the Marina, but soon the other launch facilities will be testing too. As we learned through the years with the Campbell Regatta, more people mean more rules.

But one good rule is to try to attend all Campbell events, good fun with a great group of people. I look forward to seeing you at one or more of these during the Winter and Spring!

#### A NEW LIFE FOR THE "LADY"

Some of you may have read that Dan Blocker's 40 foot Campbell, THE LADY IN CEMENT, (named after one of his favorite movie roles) burned off Huntington Harbor on the Labor Day weekend. Dan, probably best know for his role as "Hoss" in the hit tv series "Bonanza", was an avid collector of Campbell boats (Bob and Judy currently own his 24 daycruiser "Missy").

When another well-known Campbell boat collector by the name of Cliff Lee read about the fire, he did some detective work, found what was left of the boat, purchased it from the insurance company, and had it towed to his home in Yucca 3 Valley by a most interesting tow vehicle (see picture). After assessing the damage, it appears that the LADY is repairable. Most of the damage was done to the helm and front cabin, but the hull is in excellent shape. Cliff and fellow Campbell owner, Bill Buchanan, plan to restore the boat, rebuild the engines, and put it next to the Lee's 32 in Huntington Harbor. The one change they plan to make is to remove the aft cabin (the boat was contructed much like a Wailer, with a central helm and fore and aft cabins), thus making the boat look like a VERY LARGE 24. So the LADY will get a bit of a face lift and a whole new life as well!
